9.00 -	<p>Opening lecture</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 15 minute background on prognosis and the relationships between risk factors and prognostic factors • Discussion of the ICF model in light of the prognostic indicators using appropriate clinical queries. 	
	<p>Distribution of cases:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Five cases will be developed for this program. The cases will cover the major areas that physical therapists commonly encounter in both the hospital and outpatient setting <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Musculoskeletal dysfunction ○ Neurologic dysfunction ○ Integumentary dysfunction ○ Cardiac dysfunction ○ Pulmonary dysfunction • Each case will contain the patient history, physical examination findings and relevant medical issues as needed

	<p>Stages of the learning process</p> <p>Stage One</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each group (they will self select the major area of interest) will meet together for 15-minutes to review the case and come up with a statement of prognosis. • (in the case of a large crowd- we will maintain the same major categories but have more groups-in each case we will not have more than seven-individuals in a group) <p>Stage Two</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Having identified, discussed and agreed on a prognosis, the group will reconvene and be given the six-week progress note. In this note we will change some of the markers or causes for changing the prognosis. • The groups will examine the progress note and determine if the prognosis should be different. <p>Stage Three</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The groups will again present to the whole class with comments by the faculty. <p>Stage Four</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The final discharge outcome report will be given to each group. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The group will discuss how well they did or did not predict the outcome (prognostic abilities). 	
	<p>Closing lecture – last 20 minutes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The prognosis issues for each major category encountered in the case studies will be reviewed by the whole class Additional issues related to prognosis will be discussed. Having discussed the actual case studies the audience will be more involved than with just a straight lecture.
